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




## **Projects are instrumental**

## **Characteristics of ITU-D Projects**

Budget

They have a separate budget envelope that includes funding for partner(s), and on some cases ITU funds.

Terms

The terms of implementation are defined in a Cooperation Agreement (and other similar documents)

Results framework

They have a results framework defined within a Project Document, which is signed with the partner together with the CA.

Timeline

The implementation timeline is defined by the Project Document

Cost recovery

They are implemented on a cost recovery basis ( AOS + interests accumulated by funds)



## **Financing Mechanisms for ITU-D Projects**



## **External funds constitute main source of funding**

9 out of 10 CHF invested in ITU-D projects is provided by funding partners



Scope and scale of ITU-D projects depend on:


- (1) the capacity of BDT to mobilize resources.

- (3) The conditions defined by the partners, and the alignment with ITU-D priorities








Funding in on-going projects per thematic area

# 3. Status of funds allocated by Council to support the implementation of WTDC-17 Regional Initiatives


## **Background**


 The 2018 Session of ITU Council approved the allocation of <u>CHF 5.0 M</u> to support the implementation the Regional Initiatives approved by WTDC-17 (RI Funds).

(Reference: 9th Plenary Meeting of C-18. Document C18/121-E)

• These funds have enabled a total of 37 projects across all regions




## Allocation of funds per region and thematic priorities



## Lessons learned to implement WTDC-22 Regional Initiatives

- RI funds played a pivotal role in raising significant external funds
- Created a surge in the creation of impactful new projects. 37 projects benefitted from external and RI funds
- The CHF 5.0 million resulted in CHF 13.6 million worth of new projects.
- As seed funds, RI funds acted as a catalyst for establishing valuable partnerships with new partners.
- Overall, RI funds were used as a good investment with high rate of return in terms of projects development and delivery that benefit significant number of countries.

## Constant strengthening of project management practices

- 90+ ITU staff certified in project management
- Publication of new ITU Project Manual in 2020
- Establishment of an internal Community of Practice of ITU Project Managers
- Hiring of dedicated project managers for projects, based on availability of resources












Quarterly assessments focused on issues management

under each Regional Director/Chief of Department to initiate the closure process early e.g., a

month before the project ends and get the closure report submitted within at least two month

after closure. PRJ will remind all Project Managers of this process and will liaise with BDT/ADM to find a way to get the financial situation of such projects immediately when the project ends.

It has become apparent that some projects are being closed without related project reports being

Submission of Quarterly reports end of this quarter was in most cases not timely. Future remedy

Although it was a quarter followed by end of year holidays, a good practice would be to initiate the quarterly report preparation early and finalize just as the quarter ends.

Tracking of timely implementation of projects needs to be tightened. Action: As part of monitoring and evaluation, PRJ must continuously remind project managers with projects that a either lagging or that have stagnated so that immediate Supervisors could be alerted to act.

Regular updates of such cases are not to wait quarterly reporting


