Frédéric Sauvage (born in October 9, 1981) is a graduate of the Paris Institute of Political Studies (Master's degree in Governmental Affairs).

He started his professional career at the French Treasury in the Ministry of Economy and Finance as Deputy Head of the Employment and Labor Market Division and then became Deputy Head of Asia and South Pacific Division where he was in charge of bilateral economic relations with Japan, Korea and the South Pacific.

He served for four years (2013-2017) at the Economic Department of the French Embassy in Tokyo, Japan, as Councilor for Industry and Innovation where he steered the organization of the France-Japan Innovation Year and was in charge of the digital industry and involved in the French Tech Tokyo initiative.
